The British National Party has a full set of policies covering all the issues and problems which affect Britain and the British people. This is a summary of our manifesto:



THE ECONOMY

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ **Help nurture and encourage new and existing British industries to be successful**
- ☑ **Protect British companies from unfair foreign imports, while promoting domestic competition**
- ☑ **Increase taxes on companies which out-source work abroad**
- ☑ **Raise the threshold for paying income tax to £15,000**
- ☑ **Reintroduce the married man's allowance and raise the inheritance tax threshold to £1 million**
- ☑ **Encourage savings, investment, worker share-ownership and profit-sharing**
- ☑ **Halve the council tax by centralising education costs and eliminating multiculturalism spending and unnecessary bureaucracy**
- ☑ **Renationalise monopoly utilities and services, compensating only individual investors and pension funds**

Only nationalism can deliver a successful economy and a prosperous people. The economy should be managed for the benefit of the nation, but instead the failed old establishment parties are wedded to laissez-faire globalism, which means that British workers must compete against those in China and India earning a pound a day. Oriental countries such as Japan, South Korea and Singapore have managed their economies to combine private enterprise competition with the national good, and these are the models the BNP would emulate. The government should be helping and encouraging British companies to be successful instead of overseeing the destruction and devastation of our manufacturing industries.

Britain is being grossly mismanaged. The level of savings is plummeting. The

'family silver' is being sold off and monopoly utilities and services are being asset-stripped, often by foreign competitors. Privatising monopolies does not benefit either the consumer or the country. The government is fixated with our GDP but this is not a good measure of a country's well-being: crime, for instance, raises GDP, but is obviously not a good thing. Taking income tax from a man with one hand while paying him benefits with the other is also absurd and inefficient. And where is the benefit in buying goods cheaply from abroad if it means we have to pay higher taxes to unemployed workers in Britain? In a world in which irreplaceable natural resources are being depleted at an alarming rate we have a duty to our children and future generations to move towards economic growth which is socially, environmentally and economically sustainable in the long-term, rather than the present 'boom and bust' policies.

Taxes are far too high, due mainly to immigration, unemployment and wasteful government overspending. Council taxes have virtually doubled in the last decade. Quality of life in Britain is being eroded when it should be improving. There is a better way - the BNP way.



SOVEREIGNTY & THE EU

The BNP's policy is to:

- Withdraw from the EU**
- Establish independent trade and travel agreements with the EU and other countries**

The BNP believes that Britain should be a sovereign country. This means we should have the right to make our own laws, our own international trade agreements and our own economic policy, and control our own borders. Unfortunately none of these things are possible while we remain in the EU. EU laws, decided by a majority vote in Brussels and Strasbourg, are superior to our own laws, and the BNP will not be able to implement the policies Britain needs while we remain a mere province of an EU superstate; this is not acceptable.

Leaving the EU is a simple matter, as Greenland showed when it left the EEC in 1985. Leaving the EU would neither damage our economy nor reduce our ability to trade with the remaining EU states; Norway and Switzerland are among the wealthiest European countries (per capita) and trade freely with the EU, yet neither is a member. Leaving the EU would also save Britain around £15 billion per year. Withdrawal from the EU would remove the right of all the recent wave of East European cheap labour immigrants to work here; while we would expect most to leave we would allow those with genuinely valuable skills to stay until Britons have been trained to replace them.

IMMIGRATION & IDENTITY

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ Deport all the two million plus who are here illegally
- ☑ Deport all those who commit crimes and whose original nationality was not British
- ☑ Review all recent grants of residence or citizenship to ensure they are still appropriate
- ☑ Offer generous grants to those of foreign descent resident here who wish to leave permanently
- ☑ Stop all new immigration except for exceptional cases
- ☑ Reject all asylum seekers who passed safe countries on their way to Britain

Immigration is out of control. Britain's population is now over 60 million and rising, solely due to immigration. Not only is Britain increasingly overcrowded, but the fact is that a country is the product of its people and if you change the people you inevitably change the nature of the country. We want Britain to remain - or return to - the way it has traditionally been. We accept that Britain always will have ethnic minorities and have no problem with this as long as they remain minorities and neither change nor seek to change the fundamental culture and identity of the indigenous peoples of the British Isles.

The current open-door policy and unrestricted, uncontrolled immigration is leading to higher crime rates, demand for more housing (driving prices out of the reach of young people), severe extra strain on the environment, traffic congestion, longer hospital waiting lists, lower educational standards, higher income taxes, lower wages, higher unemployment, loss of British identity, a breakdown in community spirit, more restrictive policing, higher council taxes, a shortage of council homes, higher levels of stress and unhappiness and a more atomised society.

CRIME & JUSTICE

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ Deport the tens of thousands of foreign criminals to serve their sentences abroad
- ☑ Make prisons more austere and make criminals serve their full sentences
- ☑ Use electronically tagged 'chain gangs' to provide labour for projects such as coastal defences
- ☑ Introduce automatic prison sentences for all repeat offenders
- ☑ Give judges the option of the death penalty for premeditated murder where guilt is incontrovertible (eg. through DNA evidence)
- ☑ Put police back on the streets and remove the political correctness shackles from them
- ☑ Allow victims of crime full freedom to defend themselves and their property
- ☑ Make joint custody of children the norm in divorce cases
- ☑ Grant anonymity to those accused of crimes until they are convicted
- ☑ Make police concentrate on real criminals and serve the public, not the state

Crime is a threat to us all. Violent crime is increasing, and burglaries and car thefts are so common that the police are overwhelmed. Political correctness is hamstringing the police on the streets, and our prisons are so full that dangerous criminals are being set free by the courts. In any case, with satellite television, sports rooms and other such comforts, many criminals find prisons more agreeable than home.

Justice is failing those who need it most. Victims of crime who fight back are themselves prosecuted. Divorce and family laws and maintenance arrangements discriminate against men, and innocent men who are falsely accused of rape have their lives ruined while their lying accusers cannot even be named. Motorists are victimised as easy targets, political activists and protesters are persecuted and the public are increasingly losing confidence in the police.



DEFENCE

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ **Strengthen our conventional forces**
- ☑ **Retain a genuinely independent nuclear deterrent and produce all our weaponry in Britain**
- ☑ **Only commit British forces when British national interests are at stake**
- ☑ **Preserve and restore our historic County Regiments**

The world is a dangerous place. The Soviet Union has collapsed but nuclear weapons are spreading, with unstable countries now developing the technology. Militant Islam is also on the rise, and international terrorism is a constant threat. Britain can only be safe if it is able to defend itself without being dependent on any other country. Britain therefore needs to have a credible and independent defence against these threats and the ability to use this wisely. The BNP does not support sending British soldiers to die in foreign conflicts at the behest of the United States, as is currently happening in Iraq.



ENVIRONMENT & FARMING

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ Stop building on green land; new housing will be built on derelict 'brown land'
- ☑ Require supermarkets to source a steadily growing percentage of their food from British farms
- ☑ Remove unsightly overhead power lines from beauty spots and bury these underground
- ☑ Create a bulk transport tax regime that pushes supermarkets to supply more local and seasonal produce
- ☑ Encourage the most extensive and rapid switch over possible to organic and low fossil fuel farming techniques
- ☑ Ban the ritual slaughter of animals without pre-stunning, and the sale of such meat
- ☑ Eliminate the unhealthy, energy intensive and cruel factory farming of livestock
- ☑ Abolish all 'stealth taxes' and other charges on household rubbish collections

'Britain's green and pleasant land' is being concreted over. Britain is one of the most densely populated countries in the world and our population is increasing - due entirely to immigration - which necessitates the building of ever more homes, which in turn places a strain on our infrastructure such as transport and water supplies. Independent environmental organisations believe that Britain's population needs to be significantly reduced. Our immigration policies will achieve this. Intensive, industrial farming techniques adopted to compete with foreign imports and sell to supermarkets are worsening the quality of our food and damaging the countryside and the livelihood of small, traditional farmers.

Together with independent environmental organisations we recognise that the environmentally sustainable 'carrying capacity' of the UK is substantially lower than its present population. We therefore believe that the below replacement birthrate of the UK should be allowed to continue in order for the population to 'drift down' instead of used as an excuse for more immigration.

HEALTH

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ **Replace 100,000 NHS bureaucrats with doctors, nurses and dentists**
- ☑ **Invest sufficient money in the NHS to provide a decent service to the British people**
- ☑ **Bring hospital cleaning back in-house and make high cleanliness a top priority**
- ☑ **End the scandal of foreign 'health tourism'**
- ☑ **Train and pay to retain British doctors, nurses and dentists instead of looting the Third World of staff who are desperately needed in their home countries**

The NHS is critically ill. NHS Trusts are sacking staff, closing wards, cancelling operations and refusing patients vital life-saving drugs. Meanwhile, 'health tourists' are costing the NHS £2 billion a year, and diseases such as TB and AIDS are on the increase as a result of immigration. British doctors and nurses are unable to find work in the NHS because we are importing medical staff (often with questionable qualifications) from the Third World where they are desperately needed. 60% of NHS staff are bureaucrats, and there are now more managers in the NHS than beds - with many earning more than £100,000 per year. The contracting out of cleaning (often to contractors employing illegal immigrants) has resulted in collapsing standards of cleanliness, with around 20,000 patients a year dying of hospital-acquired infections.

'Marketisation', and particularly the Conservative-created Private Finance Initiative (PFI) schemes imposed by Gordon Brown, has been a disaster which is saddling Trusts and the taxpayer with enormous debts. We totally reject this attempt to turn the nation's health service into a private profit centre for giant corporations.

EDUCATION

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ Restore discipline - including corporal punishment - uniforms, traditional teaching methods and stricter exams (eg. 'O' levels)
- ☑ Reintroduce grammar schools with entrance exams at 11 and 13
- ☑ Reverse the closure of special needs schools which penalises the most vulnerable
- ☑ Reintroduce competitive sports and daily Christian assemblies
- ☑ Ensure all students are literate and numerate and are taught British history
- ☑ Abolish fees and restore full grants to university students studying proper subjects
- ☑ Improve school food as proper meals have been shown to be linked to behaviour and achievement. Food should be sourced from local suppliers whenever possible
- ☑ End the scandalous and racist neglect that has left working class white boys at the bottom of the table for academic achievement
- ☑ Give home-schooling parents tax-breaks or their fair share of the education budget
- ☑ Introduce a compulsory Community Award Scheme for all school-leavers to teach them work ethics and social and community values

Education isn't working. Exams have been dumbed-down and while more students are obtaining meaningless bits of paper employers are complaining that graduates cannot spell. 'Citizenship' lessons are a euphemism for political indoctrination. Discipline has collapsed, trendy teaching methods have failed and schools face a crisis. The abolition of grants and introduction of fees for university students has hit poor children hardest, while soft, useless subjects are replacing the hard sciences of value to Britain.

The Government's Building Schools for the Future (BSF) scheme, under which £20 billion of PFI money is to be spent on rebuilding every secondary school in England must be halted. Not only is the PFI element a gigantic fraud against the taxpayer, but BSF is a giant social engineering scheme designed to remove from parents (except those rich enough to go private) the right to decide where their children go to school, and to forcibly 'integrate' them.

While most young men and girls are thoroughly decent, many others are unemployable, ill-disciplined, self-centred and anti-social. We believe that all school-leavers should undertake a one-year 'Community Award Scheme' working in the community as the final element of their education. This would consist of work caring for the elderly or handicapped people, or environmental or heritage restoration projects, or military training. Which course an individual would go on would depend on his or her scholastic record and suitability. These courses would be character-building and instil discipline, social and community values and work ethics in all young people. Service in this scheme would entitle each individual to 'something back' from the society to which they have learnt to contribute, such as free university education, a properly supported apprenticeship, or business training and start-up capital for would-be entrepreneurs.



WELFARE & HOUSING

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ **Make all benefits and social housing only available to British citizens**
- ☑ **Introduce a system of workfare for those on unemployment benefit for more than six months with compulsory work and training in return for decent payment**
- ☑ **Make length of residency in an area the key criterion for council house allocation**
- ☑ **Preserve the 'right to buy' of individual tenants, but with the money from sales being used to build more council houses**
- ☑ **Take all privatised social housing stock back under local democratically controlled council ownership**

'A land fit for heroes'. That was the promise once made to the British people, but it is a promise that has been betrayed. Britain has become a land where foreigners and scroungers come first, and decent, hard-working Britons are taken advantage of. Immigrants come here and are immediately given council homes while Britons are pushed further and further back in the queue. Scroungers - both foreign and home-grown - sit at home and receive benefits paid for by high taxation. The BNP will redress the balance.

ENERGY & TRANSPORT

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ **Develop alternative transport fuels such as bio-diesel and hydrogen**
- ☑ **Develop renewable energy sources such as off-shore wind farms, wave, tidal and solar energy**
- ☑ **Investigate the feasibility of cutting-edge, intrinsically-safe, fast-breeder nuclear stations**
- ☑ **Invest in a high-speed, magnetic levitation, inter-city rail network**
- ☑ **Allow the building of a new privately-funded airport on reclaimed land in the Thames estuary to reduce the pressure on, and stop the constant expansion of, the South East's airports**
- ☑ **Stop the persecution of motorists by, for instance, reducing the number of speed cameras**
- ☑ **Abolish the road fund licence and the hidden tax known as the 'congestion charge'**

Oil and gas are finite resources, rapidly being depleted. Prices are going to continue to rise significantly and this will place a heavy burden on both industry and private consumers. Furthermore, as we are becoming increasingly dependent on energy from unstable and potentially unfriendly foreign powers we are becoming ever more vulnerable to economic blackmail or even harm. 'Peak Oil' is a clear and imminent danger to our economy and society, so Britain needs to invest in new technologies and be broadly self-sufficient in terms of energy.

Climate change is a threat to Britain and current evidence suggests that some of it may be man-made; even if this is not the case the principle of 'better safe than sorry' applies and we should try to minimise the emission of greenhouse

gases and other pollutants.

Our transport infrastructure is grinding to a halt. Reducing the population will help reduce road congestion, but we also need a modern rail network that attracts passengers by providing high-speed travel (over 300 mph), and we need to reduce the misery of those living near noisy and ever-expanding airports.



DEMOCRACY & FREEDOM

The BNP's policy is to:

- ☑ Abolish 'anti-discrimination' laws which prevent people from making a free choice
- ☑ Abolish all restrictions on traditional free speech; common law provisions against incitement to violence are the only proper limits in a free society
- ☑ Reject ID cards, intrusive surveillance and the retention of DNA samples of the innocent
- ☑ Introduce an English parliament within the United Kingdom
- ☑ Devolve powers to the lowest local level practical
- ☑ Introduce citizen-initiated referenda whose outcome is binding on parliament

'Power corrupts' - and we now have the most corrupt government ever.

We believe in a return to traditional British freedoms and want the people to be the masters, not the politicians. The iniquity of Scottish and Welsh MPs voting on issues that only affect England has angered many English people and needs to be resolved to prevent a break-up of the Union.
